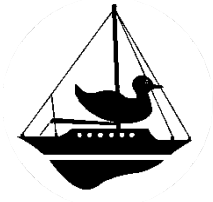

From the President

In the February *Weathervane*, Ken Paquin offered thanks to the many Ulmstead volunteers, without whom our neighborhood would lack so many of the extras that we take for granted. Now, in my first letter as your new president, let me return the favor and thank Ken for his three years of service on the board. As president, he led us with a steady hand, good humor, and an artist's touch when it comes to tact and diplomacy.

Thank you also to so many of you for making the UCI Annual Meeting part of your Valentine's Day weekend. Eighty households were represented. We loved having your participation and your enthusiasm for improving our neighborhood. We welcomed Kathy Pruissen and Renee Kardash as the new Membership Department managers, Kathy Jacobs as the new Tennis manager, and Mike Murphy and Mike Slavin as the newest Board members elected at the meeting to three-year terms. The meeting included the usual department reports and lengthy discussion of the tradeoffs of cameras versus patrols to maximize the security of members' and club's property. Those discussions will surely continue this year. We reviewed the 2015 year-end financial summary and heard an update on the Thompson et al v. UCI lawsuit. Both are included in this *Weathervane*.

When the floor was opened to new business, George Collis offered a motion to add a line item for long-term capital reserves to the annual budget. By requiring that this line item be included with other costs for UCI maintenance and operating expenses, this motion would ensure that the Board annually discusses a plan for capital replacements/repairs and includes it as a topic of discussion at the annual budget meeting every November. The membership approved the motion after confirming that the amount listed in this line item could be zero, and any nonzero amount determined by the Board would be subject to approval by the community.

Then, before adjourning, Ken announced that Randy Goff was the recipient of this year's Community Service Award for his countless hours of legal advice and assistance to UCI, serving the best interests of Ulmstead members going back many years. This past year, he served as a subject matter expert to both the Board and our hired attorney, and he continues to make himself available for our pressing legal matters – even while also serving as President of the Annapolis Rotary Club and other involvements. Thanks Randy!

Now that the Annual Meeting has come and gone, that means spring is coming soon. The groundhog said so. Trees will bud, flowers will bloom, and I am sure that real estate for sale signs will sprout too in front of several homes. If you are planning to sell your home, please be sure that your agent not only tells buyers about the wonderful amenities that come with living in Ulmstead, but also tells buyers about UCI. The beach park, docks, boat ramp, barn recreation rooms, tennis courts, and ball field are some of the many reasons we choose to live here, but they cost money to maintain, as we learned all too well at the last budget meeting. We don't want a new homeowner's excitement about moving to Ulmstead to be quashed by the surprise of having to pay dues to use the amenities. We are not a homeowner's association, so there may not be a legal requirement that sellers disclose facts about UCI to buyers. But it is the right thing to do. Please help us by giving the appropriate information to your realtor. We will also do our part. We will update the website to make it easier to find the information buyers need. And as we learn of homes for sale, Victor Knox has volunteered to make sure that the agents hear from UCI too.

In closing, let me remind you that all community members are welcome to attend Board meetings. The next one will be at 7:30pm on Wednesday, March 16. Then they will occur at 7:30pm on the first Wednesday of every month (April 6, May 4, etc.), at the barn. Oh, and one more thing: Don't forget that slip selection is Saturday, March 5th. See you there.

Update on the Lawsuit

Our hired attorney, Allan A. Noble of Budow and Noble, P.C., provided the following information to share at the Annual Meeting:

The lawsuit filed by the Plaintiffs, Don Ray Thompson, Johanna Maria Thompson, and Ashley Thompson, against Ulmstead Club, Inc. is proceeding in the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County. Extensive discovery has been exchanged between the parties, including documentation and written Answers to Interrogatories (or questions). Depositions have been taken by both Plaintiff's counsel and by myself on behalf of Ulmstead Club.

Currently, we are working with the following court dates:

- Mediation scheduled before Annapolis attorney Jonathan Kagan - March 2;
- Pretrial Conference - April 6, 2016

At this time, we have completed all discovery that we believe is necessary for us to file a Motion for Summary Judgment. [It was filed on February 19.] Thereafter, we expect Plaintiffs will file an Opposition and the Court will probably set the matter in for oral argument. A Motion for Summary Judgment requests that the Court dismiss the Plaintiffs' case on the grounds that even taking the facts advanced by Plaintiffs in a light most favorable to the Plaintiffs, that we are entitled to judgment as a matter of law. Based upon the information that we have developed during discovery, I believe our Motion will be well-founded and should be favorably received by the Court.

However, there is no way to predict with any certainty which way the Court will rule. If the Court rules in our favor, then the case will be over. If the Court denies our Motion, then we will proceed with the Pretrial Conference in April at which time the Court will set in a trial date. At this point I cannot predict when trial will be scheduled, but it will probably be in the fall.

Note 1: An electrical power surcharge will be charged to boats normally remaining connected to dock power for the purpose of running air conditioners, refrigerators, de-humidifiers, electric heaters over the winter or other heavy users of electrical power. This charge is payable in full at slip selection.

New Residents

To become eligible to use the UCI Nautical Facilities, you must both join UCI and notify the Nautical Department manager in writing that you wish to be placed on the Nautical Department slip selection priority list. Slip selection priority is assigned on a priority basis according to the date such notice is received by the Nautical Department manager. Please note that you don't have to own or plan to own a boat to register to be on the Nautical Department Slip Selection List, and since there is no cost for being placed or maintained on the list...there is no reason not to place your name on the list to secure your registration date.

Show Bee's Some Love

PLEASE STOP USING BEE KILLING PESTICIDES

1 OUT OF 3 BITES OF FOOD AMERICANS EAT IS DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY DERIVED FROM HONEYBEE POLLINATION

You know the old saying, no farmers, no food? Well, an equally appropriate one may as well be: no bees, no food. Honey bees pollinate plants and flowers that result in nearly a third of the food we eat. Without them, those plants cannot reproduce and grow. In case you hadn't heard, bees are in serious trouble, and they need our help.

THINGS TO DO TO SAVE THE BEES AND POLLINATORS

1. Plant bee friendly flowers & herbs
2. Lay off the spray- explore alternatives. If you must use a pesticide, herbicide or fungicide in your yard or garden, consider one that is the least toxic and does not persist on vegetation. Apply it in the evening when most pollinators are not as active.
3. Support local farmers and buy organic foods for your table and organic seeds and seedlings for your garden

DID YOU KNOW?

- + 80% Of pollination comes from honey bees
- + No bees = no pollination = no fruits or vegetables
- + Some other pollinators include hummingbirds, bumble bees, butterflies, moths, and bats.
- + Male bees called drones don't have a stinger and therefore can't sting you.
- + At least 2 Ulmstead Estates family's keep honey bees

NO BEES, NO FOOD.

Of 100 major crops, 70 are pollinated by bees—including apples, cucumbers, broccoli, onions, pumpkins, avocados, almonds, and so many more.

But America's bees are in crisis. These critical pollinators are dying at some of the highest rates ever recorded—a whopping 42 percent of U.S. bee colonies collapsed in 2015, well above the average 31 percent that have been dying each winter for nearly a decade. Their devastating decline is due in large part to the skyrocketing use of dangerous pesticides called neonicotinoids, or neonics, unleashed by multinational chemical giants like Bayer, Monsanto, and Syngenta.

Bees are also suffering from the loss of wildflower habitat, rapidly spreading diseases, and climate change. As a result, our hardworking pollinators are stressed out and even more susceptible to pesticide poisoning—and the future of America's food supply is left hanging in the balance.

Loss of habitat from land use change and the widespread use of herbicides like atrazine, glyphosate (Roundup), and 2,4-D that kill off the blooming wild flowers and groundcover like clover that bees rely on for food.
