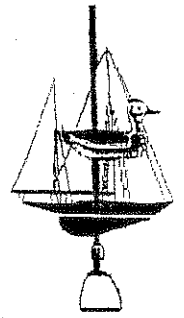

From the President

It seems like the Fall season is so brief and the holidays come so fast that it is difficult to keep up. We go from buying Halloween candy directly to turkey eating. Then, promptly at midnight after Thanksgiving, we are told to report to the malls because there are things we must buy at amazing discounts prices. The merchandising machine is in high gear and many of us fall for the same lines every time. Please take a moment to remember what is really important. The doorbusters and early-bird specials are only for the first six hours!! I'm just glad the frenzy will stop at Christmas. Yes, I know that is a pipe dream.

I want to thank all the UCI members who attended our recent annual Budget Meeting on November 12th. The Board and Dock Committee were encouraged by the level of support, given by many members, for our efforts to address recapitalization of our ammenities. Along with the approval of our operating budget the membership voted to support the Dock II rebuild with the following approved motion:

To approve of the capital project to expend UCI funds to contribute to the replacement of Dock II at a projected cost of \$1,050,000. This approval includes the following:

- Collection of a special assessment of \$300 per household per year over the 2012-2016 time period that is dedicated to replacing Dock II, for a total of \$1,500 per member collected over five years.
- Dues+Special Assessment = \$525 in 2012, invoiced at \$275 in January and \$250 in June, each payment due in 30 days. You can optionally pay the full amount in January. A \$25 late fee will be added to billings not paid by the due date.
- Authorizaton for the Board to take out a Bridge Loan of up to \$400,000 on behalf of UCI to pay the construction contractor.
- Remaining costs of the project will be paid by the Nautical Department.

Now the process of bringing our plans and projections to life begins. The Dock Committee will soon be restructured to take this next step, so if you are interested in joining this effort, you will be most welcome.

FUN FUN FUN!!!! Some upcoming events for your already-crowded calender. This year on Dec. 11th the annual fire department "Santa Run" so please bring new, unwrapped toys for needy kids to the Barn for a great event so you don't get coal in your stocking (or risk getting run over by an angry Santa driving a 20 ton fire truck). You can use vigil candles, plumbers candles, or some of the 4 hour luminary candles we will sell for 15 cents each. (I buy them at Michaels Craft Store. If you know where we can get them for less, please let me know!)

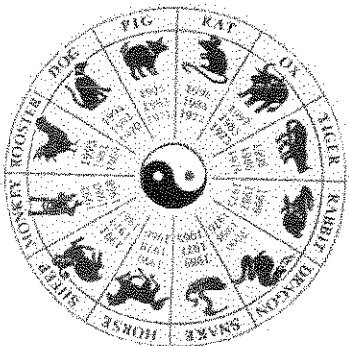

ULMSTEAD SWIM CLUB

The Swim Club Board thanks all members who turned in proxies or showed up for the general meeting. A quorum was met, a budget was approved, and a new Board was voted in. One important change to the bylaws was approved, changing the bond requirement for resident members (discussed below). Due to liability concerns, and on the strong advice of the Club's insurer, the parking lot will be gated and locked during all non-pool hours, and, no trespassing signs will be posted.

We reviewed the budgets of the past three years and noted that resident memberships to the Swim Club have been decreasing, while non-resident memberships have been increasing. The Swim Club expenses are expected to remain relatively stable from last year. Capital improvements to be made in the 2012-2013 season are expected to be \$30,000 for resurfacing the baby pool, new coping around the main pool, and a new entrance sign.

The pool is an aging facility, like other UCI assets, and will need substantial work in the next five years, particularly the resurfacing of the main pool. The Board is working to balance the needs for this maintenance with significant financial constraints. To that end, we have considered several fundraising ideas. The idea to rent space in the parking lot for winter boat storage has been tabled, given concerns from our insurer, the Zoning Commission, and residents. The Board will engage the same capital planner used by UCI to help us with the necessary long-term planning to maintain our important community asset. As we raised at the general UCI meeting, we feel the community also needs to consider ways in which the pool could be included in overall UCI capital improvement planning. In order to begin to raise the capital needed for the upcoming large renovations, the Members have approved a change to the bylaws regarding the bond requirement for resident members, and will consider changing the membership structure in the future to better reflect the needs and desires of its members.

As of November 16, 2011, any time a resident member of the Swim Club changes membership tiers (e.g., from family membership to silver or individual), that member will be required to maintain their bond with the Swim Club. This change is in line with other local pools, and will hopefully work towards stabilizing our finances.

During our review of the boat storage idea, our insurer made it clear that they did not want any use of the parking lot during non-pool hours. In order to satisfy their concerns, and keep our insurance premium from rising, the pool parking lot is now considered closed and off-limits during all non-pool hours, year-round. For liability purposes, the entire pool property is considered one, and so opening the parking lot to use is tantamount to opening the pool to use. The gate will be closed and locked, and no trespassing signs will be posted. We appreciate your cooperation, and regret that we must take this step.

While the Board has been sworn in for the 2012-2013 season, we would like to get you thinking about volunteering for the 2013-2014 season. At that time, the positions of President, Treasurer, and Maintenance will be open and we will be looking for replacements. Feel free to speak with current Board members about these positions if you have any interest.
