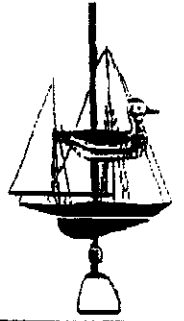

DUMPSTERS ARE COMING JUNE 17 & 18!

Finally! The waiting is almost over. The dumpsters will be arriving at Ulmstead Beach parking lot by noon on June 17 and will remain all day on June 18. They will be removed early the following morning. Just a "heads up" about a few things which have caused problems in years past: **IF THE DUMPSTER IS FULL AND THE DOOR IS CLOSED, PLEASE DON'T RE-OPEN THE DOOR. YOU MAY START AN AVALANCHE OR YOU MAY MAKE IT IMPOSSIBLE FOR ME TO RE-CLOSE THE DOOR WITHOUT CLIMBING AROUND IN THERE AND TRYING TO PUSH HEAVY, DIRTY TRASH BACK.** Please do not throw trash over the top if the dumpster appears to be overflowing. The dumpster crew must deploy a cover over the top before taking the dumpster away. If it is piled too high with excess trash, the operator will throw out the excess on the ground. If you try to leave large items like refrigerators, stoves, freezers, air conditioners, etc. they will not take them. Call A.A. County bulk trash pick-up instead for a pick up at your own house. Much simpler. If the dumpster is full, **DO NOT LEAVE YOUR TRASH ON THE GROUND FOR ME TO PICK UP.** Your mama taught you better than that. Thank you. Here is the list of unacceptable materials. No junk automobiles, trailers, gas or propane tanks, tree trunks, oil drums, liquids, hazardous wastes, boats, tires, logs, paint, refrigerators or air conditioners.

June 2009 NAUTICAL DEPARTMENT

Around The Docks

It has been a very busy start to the season! Many of you may have visited the new parking lot down at Dock 1. The job came off just perfectly and without the able help of Pat Shay, we could not have done it. Speaking of Pat, he has also been busy getting the permitting and install done for the nice new shed down at Dock 2. It would seem a simple thing to get a prefab shed and put it in a parking lot, but believe me in Anne Arundel County, it is not. Thanks to Pat for getting it done.

By the time you receive this Weathervane, many of you will have noticed the construction of a three wall shelter on the Dock 2 deck. Inside this shelter will go the nice new ice maker that Dave Mahanes has been working to get the community. Dave and his crew were able to pick up the machine and it is now available for installation. The shed will have the electrical hook up for the machine and I hope to prevail upon our cool plumbing crew (Dave McCoun, Roger Kouhi and Larry Honarvar) to help me get the water hooked up to the ice maker as well. Water, shelter, electricity and the new machine all equal ice at Dock 2 very very shortly.

Speaking of electricity, we have basically finished the bulk of the electrical work for the season. Dock 2 has all safe outlet boxes and distribution panels, inspected by the County and all. Thanks to Jeff Lewis and Tim Weller for helping coordinate this final phase of the work. It is hard to overstate how time consuming this kind of thing is and both of these two kind folks have been so very helpful here. I know that we could use some better area lighting at Dock 2 and Tim has some good ideas in this department. Frankly, I just need to catch my breath before I can take on another piece of work.

I would like to thank whom ever took the time to mow the grass down at Dock 2 recently. I am looking for a grass mower and weed puller for the summer for the Docks so if any one has a teenager that would like to earn some money or has a reliable lawn service that they could recommend, I would appreciate a call or email.

13th Annual Dock Party. Speaking of catching my breath, on *Friday* evening, July 3rd, we'll kick off the 4th of July weekend with the Nautical Department's Annual Dock Party again featuring live entertainment by Ellis. The entire community is welcome - just bring 'finger food' to share. This year, I am in need of some volunteers to handle the set up for the party. Both the Honarvars and the Cooleys have weddings to attend on July 3rd. I will not be back in Arnold until at least 10PM on July 3rd. Volunteers (including a Chief Party Officer to coordinate) are needed to help set up and clean up for this FREE party. If you can help, give me a call right away. (See separate Notice).

Small Boat Owners - Please Note: As reported previously, all boats which are stored out of the water at dock 1 or 2 must display a UCI boat sticker. These must be on your boat by June 1st. In mid June, boats not displaying a sticker will be segregated into a separate area for their owners to claim before they are discarded. To get your sticker, please contact Lynn Andrews. Those who have previously paid for a sticker will receive theirs shortly. Both the beach/parking lot/kayak rack areas at Dock 2 and Dock 1 are open for use on a first come first serve basis. I have already noticed a few small boats with out stickers, so please get them so I don't have to start putting boats into the Dock 2 parking lot and writing lots of letters etc.

Launching Ramp Reminder: Please note section 8 of the nautical department general rules which state that temporary, daily parking of cars and/or trailers belonging to UCI members and/or their guests is permitted at the launching ramp parking lot. Accordingly, any trailer or boat and trailer left for greater than 1 day at Dock 1, 2 or Lynch Point dock will be considered as "abandoned" and may be secured in place or removed of at the discretion of the Nautical Department Manager. Any costs for the removal of trailers from dock parking lots will be borne by the owner of the trailer. On a case-by-case basis, the Nautical Department Manager may approve the parking of trailers in the dock parking lots for periods of

greater than 1 day. It is the responsibility of the owner of the trailer to obtain such an approval from the Nautical Department Manager in advance of multi-day use of the parking lot.

Slip Assignments. The slip, mooring wire, and floating dock assignments, and slip change waiting list have been posted at Dock 2. There are still some slips left at Dock 2 and on the third floating dock. Please give me a call if you are interested in one. They are indicated as vacant in the posted diagrams. A slip change request list is maintained and posted at Dock 2. If you desire a slip change, call me and I'll add you to the list. As usual, all slip assignments and moves will be made on the basis of your Nautical Department priority number.

New Residents - Non Nautical Department Members. Nautical Department slip assignments are administrated in accordance with UCI By-Laws which states: 'the members (slip selection) priority shall be determined by the date a written request for a slip priority is received by the manager of the Nautical Department as evidenced by a date notation made by the (Nautical Department) manager.' (UCI By-Laws Article VIII, Section 7). Accordingly, to become eligible to use the UCI Nautical Facilities, you must both join UCI and notify the Nautical Department manager in writing that you wish to be placed on the Nautical Department slip selection priority list. In accordance with the UCI By-Laws, Slip selection priority is assigned on a priority basis according to the date such notice is received by the Nautical Department manager. Please note that you don't have to own or plan to own a boat to register to be on the Nautical Department Slip Selection List, and since there are no fees for being placed on or maintained on the list...there is no reason not to place your name on the list to secure your registration date.

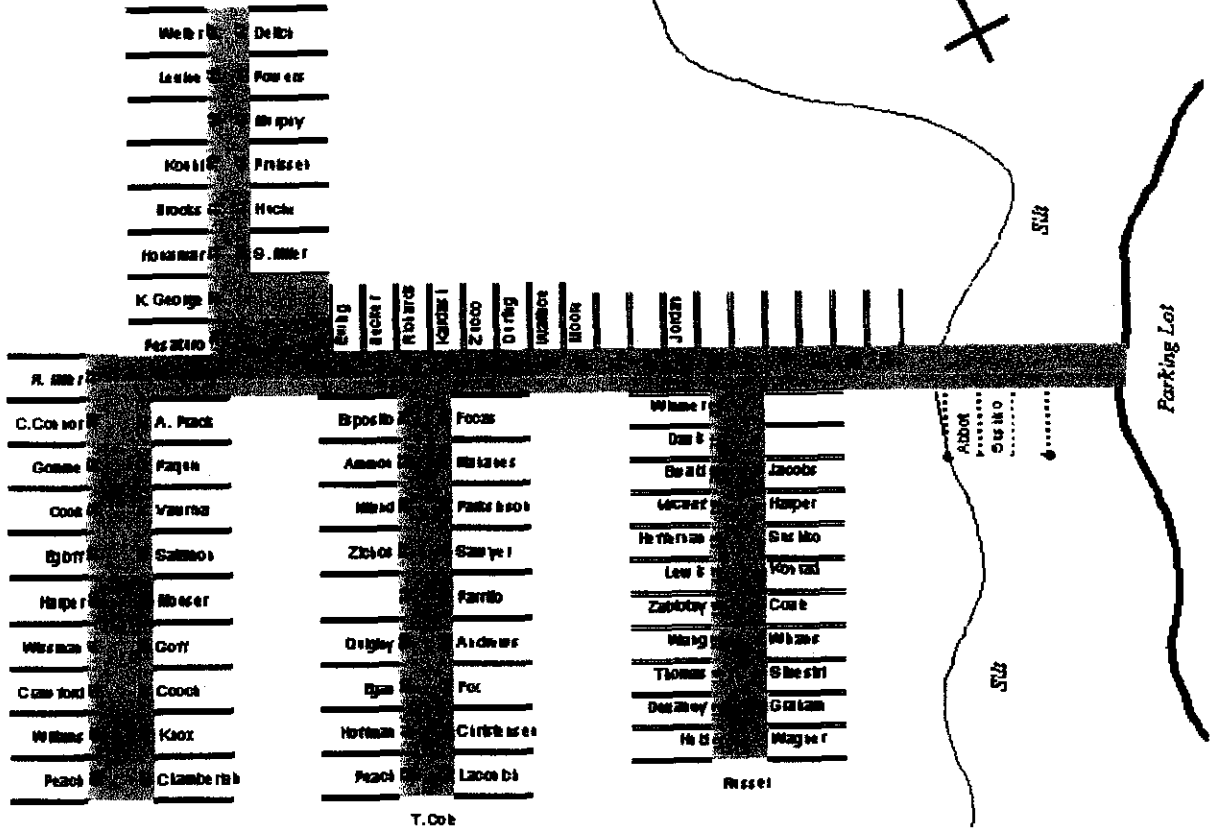

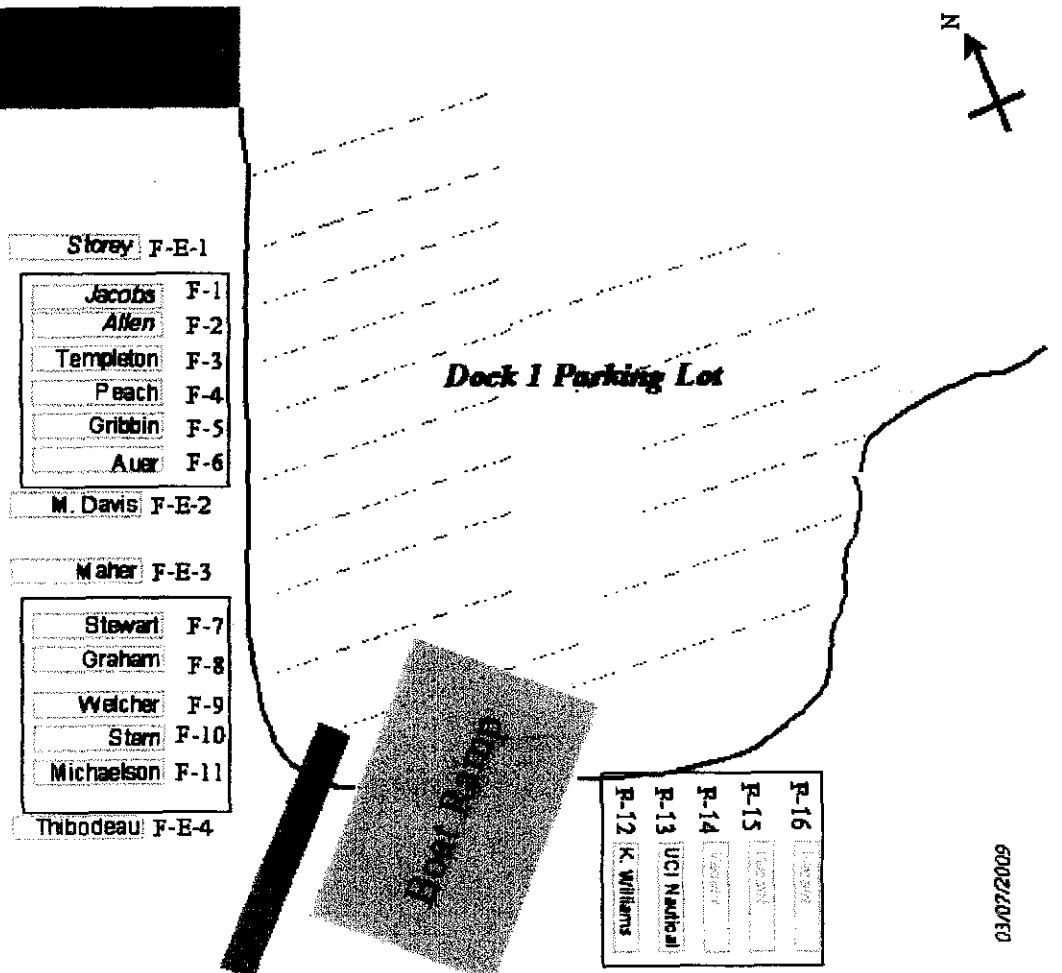

2009 Year Dock 2 Slip Assignments

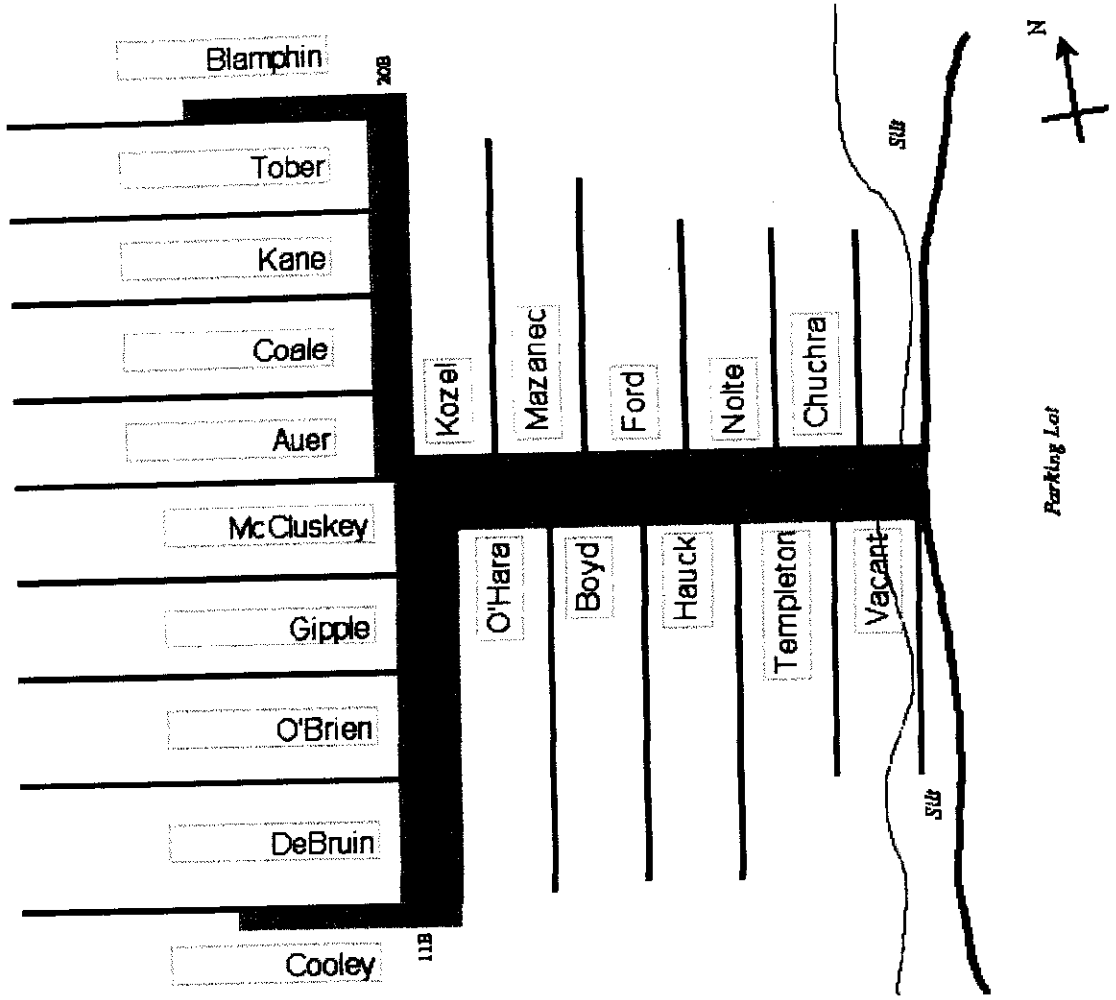


2009 Floating Dock Slip Assignments

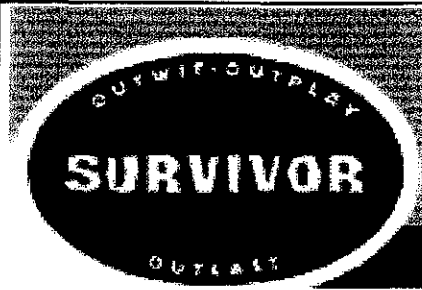
Magothy Oyster Gardening program needs volunteers!

When you enter through the gate, check in with the lifeguard staff by giving them your name. If you have any guests, the guard will annotate the use of a guest pass on your membership card. Please be patient and ask your kids for some extra patience too as we have new lifeguards that will not know faces, and they will be learning our card system during the first part of the season.

Please remember that children who are born in 1999 or later must be accompanied by an adult or guardian who is at least 15 years of age.
