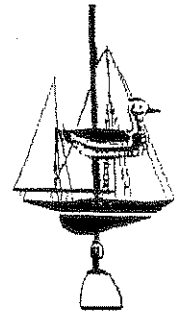

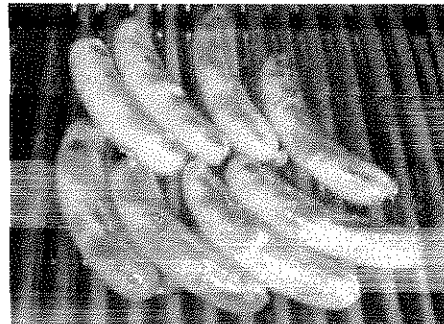
November 12th- UCI Annual Budget Meeting. This will be the meeting where the decision will be made by the community regarding the future of Dock 2.

IN MEMORIAM

Donald John Treacy, Sr.

(September 7, 1942 - June 28, 2011)

Professor Donald J. Treacy, Sr., a 43 year resident of Arnold, died suddenly June 28 at Anne Arundel Medical Center of cardiac arrest.

Born, September 7, 1942 in Washington, DC, Mr. Treacy was the son of the late Hubert J. Treacy, Jr. and Eileen Collins Treacy.

He earned a BS in Physics from Boston College and a MA and PhD from Princeton University. A professor in the Physics Department at the US Naval Academy from 1967 until his retirement in 2007, Professor Treacy was named Professor Emeritus in 2008.

Professor Treacy was a Eucharist Minister at St. Andrew by the Bay Catholic Church and was very active in community activities. He was a former board member and president of Ulmstead Club, Inc., and a founding member and president of the Ulmstead Swim Club and the first coach of the Ulmstead swim team. Additionally, he was the first varsity girls' soccer coach at St. Mary's High School in Annapolis. For many years he coached GARCI youth sports for his children's teams. He was also a volunteer for Hospice of the Chesapeake.

He was extremely proud of his Irish heritage and had completed extensive genealogy research into his family. He enjoyed golf, scuba diving, sports, pool, poker and showing his prized classic Jaguar convertible.

Don married the former Kathleen A. MacSweeney in September, 1967 in Oswego, NY. In addition to his wife of almost 44 years, he is survived by four children: Kathleen C. Treacy Clark (Brett) of Havre de Grace; Donald J. Treacy, Jr. (Kelly) of Woodbine; Brian M. Treacy (Kimberly) of Santa Clarita, CA; and Michael M. Treacy of Arnold. He was the beloved Pop-Pop of nine grandchildren: Brianna, Dominic, Matthew and Gabriella Clark; Delaney, Brennan and Keagan Treacy; and Cooper and Finnian Treacy. Professor Treacy is also survived by 5 sisters-in-law, 5 brothers-in-law, many nieces, nephews, and his cousins.

Dear Friends:

Don Treacy loved living in Ulmstead Estates for nearly 43 years. He enjoyed everything about it: the Barn, the tennis courts, the softball field, the swimming pool, the docks and sunsets at the beach, but most of all he enjoyed the people who live in the community – our friends and neighbors.

Our family could never have survived the shock and devastation of his sudden and completely unexpected death on June 28 without the caring support of you all. Your cards, your kind words, your phone calls, the beautiful flowers at Barranco's, the bountiful food both at our home and at the Barn gathering after the funeral mass, and your very presence are much appreciated.

As someone recently reminded me, friends are a blessing of the heart and we feel truly blessed.

NAUTICAL DEPARTMENT

It's time for the annual fishing tournament! So, make plans to join us for a great day of fishing on the plentiful waters that surround our beautiful community. It's a great opportunity to join in the fun of sport fishing with neighbors and friends. And, don't forget, to attend the traditional Fish Fry on the following day at the beach, where all will enjoy the catch of the tournament. As usual, trophies and certificates will be awarded in a variety of categories. Registration form and rules are included in the Weathervane. If you have any questions, please contact Frank Gomme.

Around The Docks: School is now back in full swing which means the summer is coming to an end, but there is still a good month or more of boating left to enjoy! We had another great July 4th Dock Party, despite some early rain showers, and thanks to everyone to helped make it possible. And a special thanks to Roger Kouhi for installing the solar lights so we could navigate the dock late at night!

All things considered things have gone pretty smoothly around the docks this summer. If you are aware of any problems or things in need of repair, please let me know. Our current objective with Dock 2 is to keep things functional and safe while the Dock Replacement Committee prepares for replacement options. I'm hoping we can nurse it along for another year! As we move through the fall season, please keep an eye out for announcements regarding work parties at both docks to prepare for winter.

Security: Other than the occasional theft of crabs from pots, I haven't been made aware of any real security issues at the docks this summer. It's up to ALL residents to question unknown persons or suspicious behavior, and please notify your Community Security Officer and/or the police if you suspect criminal activity. Additionally, please remember to lock the launching ramp after you use it.

FALL STORMS HEAD FOR ULMSTEAD: As I write this Hurricane Irene is bearing down on the mid-Atlantic, which prompts me to remind everyone to pay attention to weather forecasts and take appropriate precautions. In addition to hurricanes, each year strong ENE winds build up large waves across the open waters between Gibson Island and Dock 2. *Every year during September and October, these waves and/or the associated heavy rainfall damage and/or sink unprepared boats at Dock 2.* In the past, these storms have caused extensive damage to Dock 2 including torn up decking and broken pilings. Please double check your dock lines, make sure there of sufficient size with plenty of chaffing protection, make sure that there is plenty of space between your boat the dock and other boats, and check your boat frequently. **Also be aware that when storm surges rise above the dock, we will be shutting off electric service as a safety precaution, so do not plan on shore power for bilge pumps or other essential equipment during storms.** If a storm is eminent and you are planning to protect your boat by pulling it, do so well in advance of the storm before winds and waves eliminate this option.

New Residents - Non Nautical Department Members: Nautical Department slip assignments are administrated in accordance with UCI By-Laws which states: 'the members (slip selection) priority shall be determined by the date *a written request* for a slip priority is received by the manager of the Nautical Department as evidenced by a date notation made by the (Nautical Department) manager.' (UCI By-Laws Article VIII, Section 7). Accordingly, to become eligible to use the UCI Nautical Facilities, you must both join UCI and notify the Nautical Department manager in writing that you wish to be placed on the Nautical Department slip selection priority list. In accordance with the UCI By-Laws, Slip selection priority is assigned on a priority basis according to the date such notice is received by the Nautical Department manager. Please note that you don't have to own or plan to own a boat to register to be on the Nautical Department Slip Selection List, and since there are no fees for being placed on or maintained on the list...there is no reason not to place your name on the list to secure your registration date.

6. Keep your catch well iced, and you are responsible for cleaning your fish, and helping your captain clean the boat.

7. Most Important: BE SAFE, and SEE RULE #1!!!

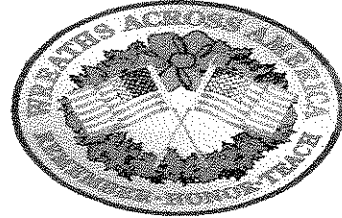

TENNIS DEPARTMENT

ULMSTEAD TENNIS COURTS

As a reminder, the Ulmstead Tennis Courts are for the use of current Ulmstead Tennis Club members and their non-resident guests. Ulmstead residents must be current dues paying Tennis Club members to use the courts and cannot play as a "guest" of another Ulmstead resident. A published list of current members is posted on the tennis courts. Dues are paid in April. If you are a lapsed member and would like to rejoin, please contact Mike Wentworth. If you do not wish to rejoin, please return your keys to Mike Wentworth and you will receive a \$20 refund of your key deposit. We are in need of extra keys for new members.

Tennis Club members are kindly requested to review the tennis club rules, and the general rules of tennis etiquette, with their children. The tennis courts are to be used only for tennis or pickleball. Biking, skateboarding, in-line skating, fireworks, squirt gun fights, straw and manure fights, shaving cream fights, manhunt, stupid pet tricks, and sitting on the net cables while making small talk are strictly prohibited. When other courts are occupied, players should restrict the volume of their conversations and color of their language so as not to disturb others. Please do not walk across or behind tennis courts adjacent tennis while a point is in play, and ask the players for permission to pass. Please empty the trash baskets when you are done playing, and recycle plastic tennis ball containers and water bottles.

If other courts are open and in playable condition, tennis players should cede Court #3 to players wishing to play pickleball, and Court #4 to players wishing to hit off the backboard or use the "Quick Start" lines for young beginners.

Pickleball Comes to Ulmstead Pickleball? What is pickleball you ask. Pickleball is a tennis like game using paddles and a whiffle ball. It is played on a tennis court surface using smaller court lines and a similar net. It is an easy game to learn and can be played with little effort. The game has been growing in popularity across the nation. It is most popular with seniors, but also with kids. There is a USA pickleball association www.usapa.org where there is more information about the game. A small group of interested players has been formed in Ulmstead, playing on one of the tennis courts that has pickleball lines. We play once a week in the evening.
